



QABA® Policy and Procedure: Denial/Revocation of Certification 6.0

The purpose of this procedure is to ensure the QABA® may consider revocation or denial of certification. Examples of the activities that may cause revocation or denial of certification include, but not limited to the following:

1. Possession, use or attempt to use altered or falsified certification cards or certificates;
2. Obtaining or attempting to obtain certification or recertification by fraud or deception;
3. Knowingly assisting another to obtain or attempt to obtain certification or recertification by fraud or deception;
4. Unauthorized possession or distribution of examination materials including reproduction of examination questions;
5. Violation of examination rules, including but not limited to, cheating on the examination.

Immediate Revocation may occur but not limited to the following circumstances

1. Ongoing monitoring of criminal background – new event
2. Allegation resulting in an abuse report as required by applicable state
 - a. and federal laws and regulations
3. Other unethical behavior
4. Practicing as an independent practitioner

The QABA® Credentialing Board retains the sole authority to amend or repeal its policies regarding denial or revocation of certification at any time including, but not limited to, the authority to add new grounds for denial or revocation and add provisions for suspension of certification.
